An Easter Candle for an Easter People!

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Already several weeks into the Easter season, it's difficult to remember the joy and exuberance with which we met our celebration of Jesus' resurrection. The Church does not give a mere nod to our Lord's victory over death and the grave. Instead, we have the longest festival season of the year! We celebrate Easter for 50 days, between His resurrection and the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles on Pentecost day.

These 50 days dawned on Good Friday as we heard the account of our Lord's suffering and death, punctuated by extinguishing one candle after another as His death neared. And then, it was finished. He gave up His spirit in death. The bright eyes of the very Light of the World were extinguished. The final candle was carried out and the tomb was sealed. A powerful visual and sensory experience. You could see, hear, and even feel the weight of sin and death.

In the darkest hour of apparent defeat, the Light returns because the victory remains with Christ. In strode an even larger candle, whose light was then spread to the candles we held in our hands, filling our darkened sorrow with warmth and light, to sing of God's abiding victory in Jesus Christ.

And ever since, the large candle has stood at the left of the altar during this Easter season, proclaiming that the Light of the World is risen indeed!

This large candle is called the "Paschal Candle." Paschal (pass-kal) once meant "Passover" and now means "Easter" since Jesus has fulfilled the feasts and sacrifices of the Old Testament. The Paschal Candle is a bold and prominent symbol of Easter and the light of Jesus' living presence with us.

There are several elements to the Paschal Candle, some you will see on ours, and others you can look for on other Paschal Candles as you visit other places.

Cross: A cross is at the center of the candle since it is focused on the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus.

Alpha and Omega ($A \Omega$) These are the first

and last letters of the Greek alphabet. Jesus claims these in Revelation 1:8. He always was and always will be, the beginning and the end.

Other Symbols:

5 nails: These are grains of incense, symbolizing the wounds of Jesus and His preparation for burial. They would be placed at the corners of the cross and the center.

Date: Paschal candles are typically used for one year, and the date is inscribed on it. Our days are in God's hands and with the year on the candle, we remember that this is the Year of our Lord.

The Paschal Candle (Easter Candle) will stand by the altar until the Ascension of our Lord, 40 days after Easter. During the reading of His ascension we will extinguish the candle symbolizing His ascension, but that is not to say that He is absent. The candle returns again and again at several important events in the lives of God's people.

Baptisms: We light the Paschal Candle at baptisms because of what Paul writes in Romans 6. In baptism we are buried with Christ into His death and into His resurrection. With the Paschal Candle burning, we have a visual connection to the days of Easter and the Light of Christ.

Funerals: It returns again at funerals where it is placed near the head of the casket. The body before us has been sanctified by the Holy Spirit to be His temple, washed in Baptism. We do not discard the body but lay it to rest with prayer and God's comforting Word reminding us that because of our unity with Christ's death and resurrection in baptism, we too will rise to new life.

The Paschal Candle is all about Jesus death and resurrection. Whenever it is burning you can remember His victory for you, and how you are united in new life with Him.

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!
