We are Waiting . . .

Waiting may be one of the hardest things to do. When we are eager for something to arrive, time seems to slow down and the waiting is excruciating. Pizzas have to be delivered in "30 minutes, or less." Paint and glue are "quick drying." Most technology is designed to speed things up and do things faster. Even the sixty seconds we spend waiting for the microwave to heat a cup of water for tea seems like an eternity.

Advent is a season of waiting. Children (of all ages) wait expectantly for Christmas Day to arrive with the joy of receiving gifts. We have waited all year for another round of celebrating the traditions and familiar sights, sounds, smells, and flavors of the season. One special way to mark time through Advent leading up to Christmas is with an **Advent Calendar**. Beginning on December 1, all the way through December 25, a traditional Advent Calendar will have a door or box to be opened each day. Behind it will be a picture and explanation, a scripture passage, and/or a special treat. Do you have a special Advent Calendar or tradition for counting the Advent days of waiting?

The people of God we hear about in the Old Testament were waiting for something they personally did not see fulfilled. God promised to Adam and Eve that He would send someone, born of a woman, to crush the head of Satan, the serpent. He reinforced this promise by sealing a covenant with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. Their descendants continued to wait on the Lord for His anointed one (Messiah). They waited in faith, though they did not see it's fulfillment with their own eyes. Faith believed the prophecy.

The New Testament ushers in the time of fulfillment, when God sends His son, Jesus, to be born of Mary to save us from our sins. This fulfillment came after centuries and millennia of waiting for God. When the time finally arrived, it was difficult for many to believe that it was really true. Even when they saw with their own eyes the signs and wonders that confined Jesus' authority, many

refused to believe. But, by faith, many did believe in the fulfillment of God's promises in Jesus. Faith believed the fulfillment.

Today we have both God's fulfillment and promises. The fulfillment of our salvation in Jesus' death and resurrection are our present reality. The promise we are waiting for today is that Jesus will come again and establish the New Heaven and the New Earth that will be our eternal home with Him. We have the prophecy, the fulfillment, and the promise of God in His Word that strengthens our faith to wait on the Lord for another day. We are waiting on the Lord even as we are rejoicing that He sent Jesus to be born in Bethlehem to set us free from our sins in His death and resurrection. Faith believes the promise.

This Advent and Christmas season join your brothers and sisters in Christ as we celebrate the theme of "We are Waiting." We wait, knowing that God will fulfill His promises as He has in the past. Take a look at the flier on the next page. The picture is a close-up of an Advent Calendar, marking the days of waiting. You'll find the schedule for lots of special events and the Christmas Eve/Day worship schedule. Mark your calendar and invite a friend, family-member, co-worker, or neighbor to come and worship with us as we wait together for the wonderful gifts of fulfillment that are ours because of God's great love. As we wait together, the time passes more quickly as we encourage each other, praying for our needs, and singing together the praises of God who remains faithful.




