Spoilers!

Back in December when the new Star Wars movie, "The Force Awakens" was released, there was something of a pact among fans not to spoil the surprises of the movie. In March, this pact exists among basketball fans who might have recorded a game during the day in hopes of watching it without knowing the ending.

Movies, TV shows, sports, plays, books, and the like are all better when you don't know the outcome in advance. The sense of suspense and that anything could happen is exhilarating but can also prove to be heartbreaking. When you know how the story ends, it changes your experience. Things are not as sad when you know they work out in the end. The joys are more sweet when you can see them developing throughout the adventure.

We are nearing in on our yearly celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. We can see the Easter light at the end of the dark, Lenten tunnel. The Church knows how the Jesus story ends, and we know how our life's story ends too.

In John, chapter 2, after Jesus has evicted the moneychangers from the courts of the temple, He declares "Destroy this temple, and in three days, I will raise it up." The Jews didn't understand what He meant and neither did His disciples. St. John goes on to write, "But he was speaking about the temple of his body. When therefore he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and believed the Scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken."

St. John gives away the ending! Now, reading his Gospel, you'll always know that Jesus ends up raised from the dead. (Ok, I know, not a big surprise.) But see how the resurrection of Jesus changed the disciples' understanding of Jesus' words and the Scriptures. After the resurrection, they understood that everything pointed toward Jesus.

The cross and resurrection of Jesus give us the key to understanding the Scriptures and to having hope in this life of trials and temptations. Knowing the ending, that Jesus has died for our sins and been raised for our justification, we can meet every trouble in this life knowing that Jesus has overcome the World. Every sin that troubles you has been died for and paid for in the work of Jesus. Sin, death, and the devil are conquered enemies that no longer can bring accusations against God's people. You are free and forgiven.

Spoiler alert! You also have a place prepared for you in heaven to rest for eternity in the light of Christ and the bliss of eternal life. Knowing this, believing this, we live in hope and rejoice that our end is with Christ Jesus.

TRUSTEES

As usual, please remove all wreaths and decorations from the cemetery by April 1, 2016 to allow for upcoming work in the cemetery and to allow for lawn mowing.

Again this year, due to freezing and thawing, we did find one leak in the Fellowship Hall again and have continued investigation as to the source. Seems the attic is becoming warmer than what should be. Additional insulation has been added without success. We may elect to contact an HVAC expert to determine causes for leaks over the past two years.

In 2016, we will again offer engraved pavers to be inserted in the cross in the Memorial Garden. A number of individuals have already placed orders. These are the 8"x 8" bricks to honor or remember family and friends. Cost is \$100 each depending upon inscription and design. Deadline for ordering the brick is May 31. The bricks will be done and installed by August. Please see Dianne Holland for more details. All proceeds go for upkeep of the cemetery.

Please mark your calendars for Spring Clean up Day for 9am on Saturday, May 7. We could use any help to keep your church clean and spotless. Depending on the weather, both inside and outside clean-up activities will be needed.

The Trustees will continue to replace the fluorescent fixtures in the narthex with LED lights. This saves on electric costs and efforts to replace bulbs and ballast.

The Trustees are also getting some bids to reseal the parking lots this year.

ALTAR FLOWERS

If you would like to have the flowers on the altar dedicated in memory of a loved one, in honor of a birthday or anniversary or simply for blessings received, you may sign up on the flower calendar in the narthex. 
