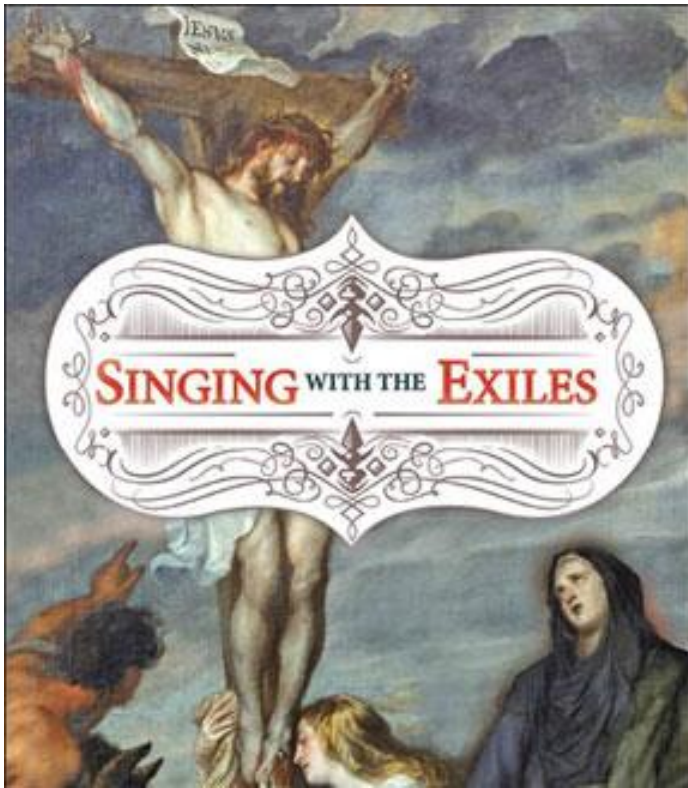
20+ Ways to Celebrate the Resurrection of Our Lord

As we prepare to celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord, I offer you a "Top 10 List" of ways to celebrate Easter. (Ok, it was only going to be 10, but I got carried away. It is Easter after all!) I look forward to the reverent intensity of Holy Week and the joyful exuberance of Easter Sunday.

1. Wake up and let the first words out of your mouth be: "CHRIST IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED! ALLELUIA!!"
2. Attend the services of Holy Week (Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, & Easter Sunday) and get the big-picture of Jesus death and resurrection for your salvation and rejoice in receiving the gifts that Easter brings to us.
3. Sing a lot of Alleluia's to make up for the Fast of Lent.
4. Pretend you are one of the women at the tomb and run and find someone to tell the news of the Resurrection.
5. Remember your Baptism.
6. Hide Easter eggs that are empty except for a small piece of paper with the words: Jesus is not here, He is Risen! (But have a pocket full of candy for kids who don't understand.)
7. Listen—REALLY listen—to the proclamation of the good news that Jesus lives so you will live too.
8. Take an Easter lily to someone not able to come to church and visit with them a while.
9. Give a ride to someone who otherwise can't make it to church.
10. FEAST! The fast of Lent is over. (9:15am, Easter Breakfast!)
11. Try eating lamb! We don't sing "At the HAM'S High Feast"! (Just try it!)
12. Eat at the Table of the Lord. It's the Feast of Feasts after all!
13. SING UNTO THE LORD! Even if you can't (or think you can't).
14. Get to church early and read through all the hymns in the Easter section of the hymnal.
15. Do 14, then ask Pastor to explain anything that doesn't make sense.
16. Hug your children.
17. Pray for the Church throughout the world, especially those who can't gather in freedom and suffer persecution for the name of Jesus.
18. Go to Easter Divine Service and rejoice in receiving the gifts that Easter brings to us.
19. Sing one more Easter Hymn before you go to bed.
20. Get ready for bed and let the last words out of your mouth be "CHRIST IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED!!!"
21. Pray with your spouse for steadfastness of faith in our risen Savior.
22. Repeat #1, 3, 4, 5, 13, 16, 17, 19, 20, & 21 daily.
23. Repeat #12 & 18 weekly (and as often as your faith hungers for it).

St. Paul Logo Design

If a picture is worth a thousand words then a distinctive logo is a real mouthful. How many of these do you recognize (even in black and white and without any text)?



My guess is, most of them. (Ok, Atari is a little obscure. But I date myself.) What about St. Paul? Close your eyes and imagine what St. Paul's logo looks like, then, turn the page.

Is it distinctive? Would anyone else be able to have our logo? What does it say about us as a congregation; our mission; what we believe, teach, and confess? What does it say about what makes us tick?

How can we use it? Does it show up well in black and white? What about on a dark background? Embroidered, embossed, or engraved?

Where did it come from? It's actually just text and the Luther rose cut out of the middle of a public domain, stained-glass image available at www.lcms.org. Lot's of congregations use that image for all kinds of things. (I have a coffee mug from my vicarage congregation with it on there.) It was never intended to be a permanent logo. We needed a graphic and we got it. What now?

With the new web site and as we try to improve our publicity and communication to our community, we need an outstanding logo. We could nab one off the internet, but it wouldn't be personal to us. We could cobble together some clip-art, but may not work like a logo should. We could hire a PR firm to "brand" us, but would they really "get" what a Christian congregation wants to tell the world? Nope.

We need something personal to our congregation, that will follow the "rules" of good logo design so we can use it in lots of ways (web, print, letterhead, engraving, stamps, postcards, shirts, signs, posters, press releases, etc.), and it needs to reflect our identity as Christians, as Lutherans, and as St. Paul, Valley City.

The Executive Board is asking if any of our talented members would like to submit a design for consideration. The design won't necessarily come from in-house, but we'd like to open the opportunity to our members before seeking out a church-focused design studio (www.scapegoatstudio.com for example).

FROM THE TRUSTEES

Spring Cleaning Day – or at least a few hours in the morning – **May 16 at 9:00am**. We welcome all members for a couple of hours of light labor to help the Custodian and Trustees do a complete dusting, cleaning and spruce up of the sanctuary and Fellowship Hall. Please set aside a few hours starting at 9:00am on Saturday, May 16 to help keep your church the way you would like to see it

The sale of the new parsonage is still in process. A number of buyer conditions had to be reworked and several inspections were delayed. We have agreed to extend the listing of the property until April 30, 2015 in case this buyer cannot complete the sale and we have other prospects.

Following the February snows and severe freezing, we did experience a number of leaks on the lower part of the eaves of both the east and west sides of the Fellowship Hall. Both the vendor who did the roof repairs last summer and a restoration company were out to inspect the damage and cause. It appears we had ice dams well above the ice shields on the roof on both sides. This caused heavy ice and snow backup on most of the roof. We removed as much snow and ice as possible as the thaw allowed. Not sure if this will happen again with the current roof. We did re-insulate portions of the roof, replaced plastic sheeting and replaced ceiling tiles. Thanks to the efforts of Mark Andrukat, Brian Dearth, Mark Gordon and all the Trustees, we were able to put all back together with a minimum of cost.

Please remove all cemetery decorations by April 10 since we will be getting ready for lawn mowing and landscaping.

The Trustees are also seeking some horticultural help in maintaining the Memorial Garden regarding weeding, pruning and general upkeep. We are thinking of a family volunteering to take on the garden upkeep for a month during the period of May through October. We would like to keep the garden as nice as possible. If we can get six families to volunteer, it would certainly be a great help. If you like to play outside and maybe get your hands dirty a bit, this could be an opportunity for you. Thank you

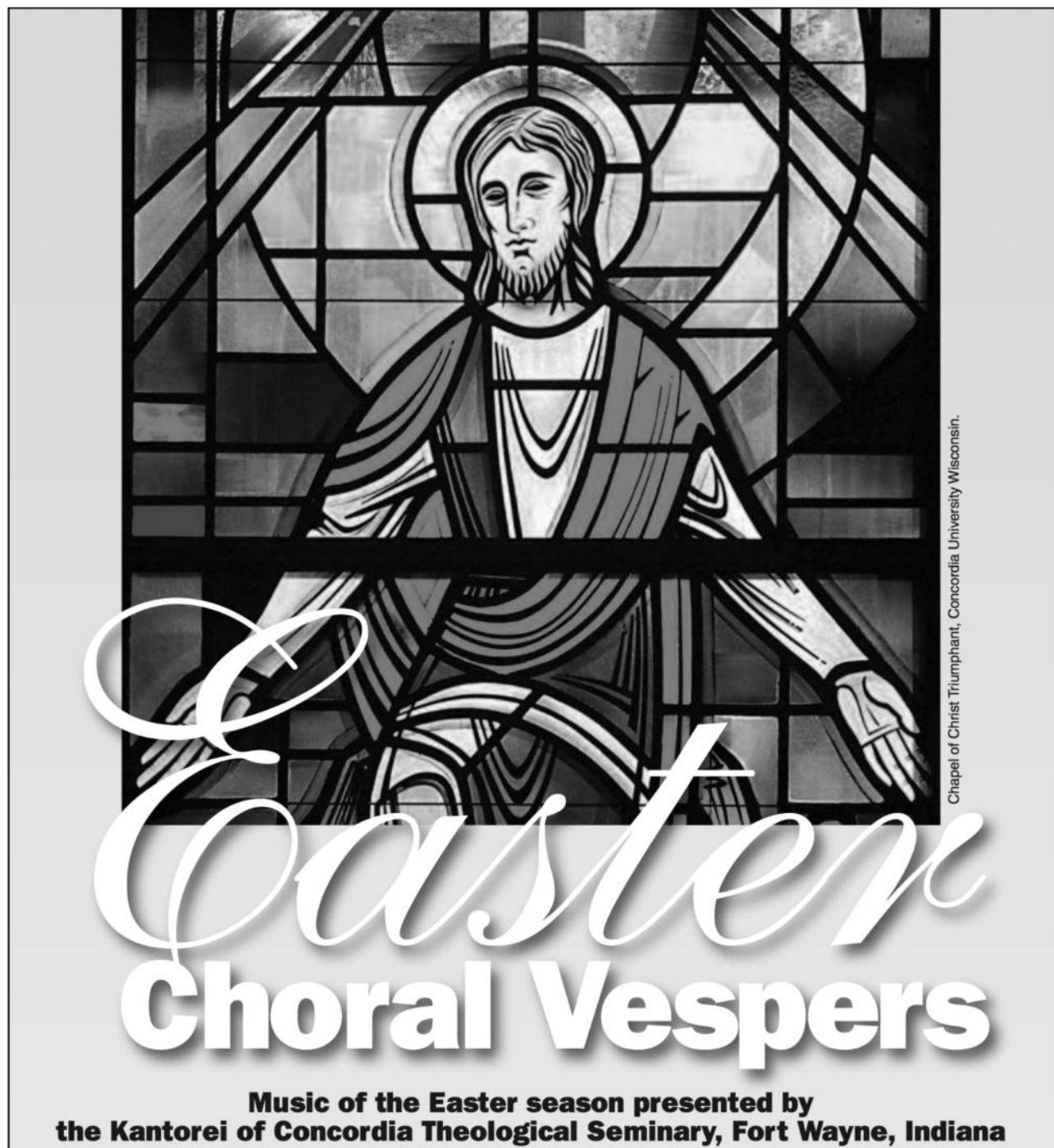

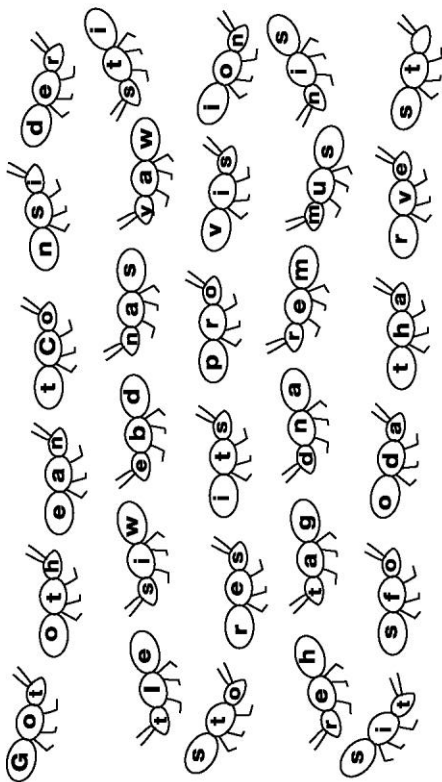
