Jim and Cheryl Brockman were looking ahead to retirement like a lot of people do: travel, hobbies, grandkids, projects, and time with each other. They enjoy all these things—and more—because of how God is using them to support Point of Grace Academy in Kenya.

Their church, Emanuel Lutheran, New Haven, Indiana, had been coordinating over-seas mission trips for several years. Jim and Cheryl took a leap of faith and joined the team headed to Kenya, in east Africa. There they worked with Pastor Dennis Meeker and his wife, Lorna, a deaconess, at Point of Grace Academy, an orphanage and school that cares for more than five hundred children.



After their second trip to Kenya, they were moved by God to continue to support Point of Grace by travelling to Kenya on their own. They have spent weeks and months at a time living with the children and even caring for the orphanage when Pastor Meeker fell and had to have surgery in the United States to mend his leg.

Now, between trips to Kenya, the Brockmans travel across the United States raising awareness and support for the work of Point of Grace for "Kenya's Kids" which supports Point of Grace and the Meekers.

A few years ago, if you had told the Brockmans what God had in store for them, it would have been hard for them to believe. But here they are—loving every minute of it!

From Vicar Buvinghausen

It is a blessing and a pleasure to be the Vicar for St. Paul, Valley City, and I thought it would be beneficial for everyone if I gave a bit of background on myself as a way for us to be better acquainted.

I grew up in the town of Richmond, which is about thirty-five miles West of Houston, Texas. I have two older half-sisters that were teenagers when I came along and so by the time I was five years old they were already off to college. So, I grew up mostly as an only child. I was baptized and confirmed in The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and participated in various church activities growing up.

At my home congregation, our associate pastor spent most of his time and energy with the youth group and he encouraged me to seriously consider going into the ministry. I found this idea appealing, but by the time I was in high school I was heavily involved with acting and theatre and I decided to go to college to pursue this passion. I went to Southwestern University in Georgetown, Texas, to major in Theatre Arts. During my senior year I had the opportunity to participate in an internship in New York City. I lived in Manhattan, in the housing that was provided for us, and I worked in a non-profit theater for the fall semester of my senior year. It was then that I started to see what it would mean to be an actor and the hardship that would come from that pursuit. Even though I loved the craft, I knew that it wasn't what I was supposed to do with my talents.

After graduating college, I spent several years trying to figure out what I wanted to do with my life. I applied to law school and worked as a paralegal, then worked as a youth leader at a Lutheran church in Northwest Houston I also pursued a Masters in Youth Ministry Leadership via an online program through Huntington University in Indiana.

There in the back of my mind—still since high school!—was my pastor's encouragement to consider being a pastor. When I was just beginning my Masters thesis work, I saw my former pastor while at a conference in Katy, Texas. We got a chance to catch up and after speaking with him I had this inclination that I was finally ready to go to the seminary. So, I applied to Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Indiana, finished my Masters degree at Huntington, and moved to Fort Wayne.

God has blessed me in all things by keeping His hand on me through the times of doubt and uncertainty. As many of you already know, I also struggle with a stutter. This is something that has been a part of my life since I first began talking. Even though I struggled with stuttering, it never kept me from pursuing the things that I was passionate about. It took a lot of hard work and yet when I went to seminary the

thought of proclaiming God's Word seemed like such a daunting task that it made my stutter more severe whenever I would conduct the liturgy or preach. What helps me put things in perspective is the fact that Moses was known to have a speech impediment himself, and even though he did, God still used him to achieve His will for His people. I keep this in mind, as well as other reminders from scripture in what I do for the Church. I even sign my letters and emails with the reference of 1 Corinthians 2:1-2, which reads, "And I, brethren, when I came to you, did not come with excellence of speech or of wisdom declaring to you the testimony of God. For I determined not to know anything among you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified."

This struggle has been one of the crosses I have carried with me my entire life, yet God has strengthened me throughout and it is my confident expectation that He will continue to do so. I consider myself blessed to able to proclaim God's saving Word of salvation through Jesus Christ's death and resurrection, all the while keeping in mind the portion of Luther's Sacristy Prayer that reads, "O Lord do not forsake me, for if ever I were to do this on my own, I would easily wreck it all."

There's always more to anyone's story and so if you would like to know more particulars please feel free to ask. I look forward to getting to know each of you better while I am here.

TRUSTEES


As many of you have heard the HVAC system for the Sanctuary portion of the church has been replaced. We had three vendors look over the system and quote a complete replacement of the air conditioner and the furnace. As it turns out the furnace heat- exchanger had four cracks in it which can lead to carbon dioxide fumes entering the church. The new equipment is high efficiency and we should see a reduction in the electric and gas bills. Total cost for this project was \$16,878.00. We will also need to look at the basement furnace before the heating season starts.

Unfortunately, we have had an ongoing problem with the roof on the new addition. We have already spent several thousand dollars over the past few years in insulation, ceiling tiles, shingles and decking under the shingles. There is a problem with the decking warping which appears to be a problem with proper ventilation in the attic area. We have had three roofers look at the roof and agree that something is causing the problem. This will be a costly repair and considering the shingles are not worn out, they will need to be torn off to get to the decking. We are looking into metal shingles vs. heavy weight asphalt shingles. The preliminary costs are approaching \$156,000 dollars. We have also had quotes estimated at about \$68,000 for asphalt shingles. This cost is for the entire church, including new addition. There will be additional miscellaneous costs associated with replacing the roof that cannot be calculated at this time until the old roof is pulled. This project has just started and as it progresses, we will keep you informed.

The trustees would like to thank Dave and Judy Scaife for their hard work in keeping the A-frame manicured and neat at the bottom of the hill. Owen Hawke, you have done a great job maintaining the hill and ditch along Lester Road and Scott Wiesemann, thanks for trimming the bushes around the buildings.

THE ALTAR GUILD is looking for a few new members. The Guild is responsible for preparing the altar and communion for each service. We rotate on a weekly basis.




