It's hard to believe that we are fast approaching fall, and with that comes some of the great parts of the Church Year with All Saints, Advent, and Christmas. This year also marks the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, which we have thankfully been seeing a lot about this entire year. What is also in store during the fall is college students coming home to visit for Thanksgiving, and Christmas break. During this time, we may get a chance to see those who have grown up in the church pay us with a little visit on a Sunday or two. Sometimes it might be hard to know how to engage with college students because of their time spent away from home. Being not all that far removed from college myself, I can remember my visits home during those breaks at holiday time. Those visits were always ripe with nostalgia, yet there was a strange sense of feeling a bit out of place. This isn't something that happens with all college age members visiting for the holidays, but it is fairly common. The distance and time of being in college can have this effect.

So, what can we do for those college students visiting? The answer is nothing out of the ordinary. Even though there may be the sense of feeling out of place on the part of the young adults, it's always good to be welcoming and genuinely glad to see them. As a millennial, I can attest to the importance that my generation places on genuine interactions. What better place to have that than in the church where God meets us in the Divine Service through His Word and Sacraments? We as Lutherans have a rich tradition that connects us to the universal church throughout the ages in the liturgy. When we gather together to receive God's gifts in the Divine Service, we join the "great cloud of witnesses" (Hebrews 12:1) that have gone before us in the faith. This especially takes place in the Sanctus when we join the angels, archangels, and all the company of heaven evermore praising God in saying, "Holy, holy, holy Lord God of Sabaoth; heaven and earth are full of thy glory" (LSB 195). These are just some of our great advantages that have nothing to do with us and everything to do with God and His gracious service to us. With this we are well equipped to share God's love with all, whether young adult members or other visitors, who walk through the doors of St. Paul.

Knowing this about the nature of worship, it is also helpful to ask if they have found a church to attend while away at college. It's hard enough being a Christian in college with all the temptations that come with the environment. It never hurts to encourage others to seek out a confessional Lutheran church to receive God's gifts to strengthen them for the inevitable hardships this world casts upon us. While searching for a church, thanks to modern technology, our college age members can watch our services online and at least hear God's Word preached for the enrichment and strengthening of their faith.

Along with all of these tremendous assets, we have opportunities to connect and have fellowship outside of the church during these breaks from school. I am setting up a meet up for all young adult/college age members at Cool Beans Café in Medina on Friday November 24rd at 3pm to meet and get to know those who are away for college and hopefully those who are attending school nearby in the Cleveland area. Hopefully, this will be the first of many opportunities for fellowship with young adult members of the congregation. Knowing that there are a great amount of college age members attending school or working in the Greater Cleveland Area there is great potential to have regular opportunities for fellowship.

So, there's no need to worry about what we can do for the young adults who grew up going to St. Paul that are now only visiting intermittently. We don't need a new program to entice them to come more regularly. All we need is to realize the reality of what God is doing through us as the church when we gather in the name of Christ. God strengthens us and provides a way for us to engage young adult members as our neighbors through our rich liturgy and hymnody. God strengthens us to genuinely reach out in love to those who were raised in the church that now only visit infrequently for various reasons. With all of these blessings, all we can do is trust in Christ's work of salvation, extend the invitation, pray, and give to God the glory that is due for whatever fruit that may come.

Pastor opened the meeting with a prayer.

The minutes were read, corrected, and approved.

Treasurers Report was presented by Michele Gatt A motion was made by Mark Andrukat to approve the Treasurers report, this was seconded by Steve Kato and approved.

Christian Nurture - Colleen Kato reported that Sunday School is going well with attendance averaging about 45 students. The Youth Group visited the zoo on October 15th and is planning the grand friends dinner on November 12th.

Board of Evangelism - David Hesketh - The neighborhood visit went well with about 32 volunteers walking Liverpool Fields and placing door hangers.
