THE BODY OF CHRIST IN A TIME OF ISOLATION

Beloved of the Lord,

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: ... a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing..." (Ecclesiastes 3:1, 5; ESV)

These days I feel that I must specifically date anything I write in assessment of our current situation. Things change SO quickly! Just days after our first letter to you describing how we would continue to meet, it became clear that we should refrain from meeting for a time. Now, our restart date has become more uncertain. We are in a season when it seems best to refrain from embracing one another in-person in the Lord's House. But, this season will not be forever and we will again meet in the Lord's House. Tomorrow may bring news that we must endure for a time longer, or news of an effective treatment or indications that the worst is behind us. It is uncertain.

It is this uncertainty that brings us to worry and makes us anxious. There are so many plans that we would like to make or re-make. But, right now, they remain uncertain. As these uncertainties trouble your heart and soul, remember the words of Jesus to His disciples during the Last Supper: "Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me." (John 14:1, ESV). We can face each of these uncertainties with a faithful confidence that God's love for you and forgiveness in Jesus are absolutely certain.

Your Pastor, together with the Elders and Executive Board, will continue to monitor the situation and recommendations so we can make decisions for the spiritual and physical care of you and the Body of Christ here at St. Paul. We remain the Body of Christ even as we are physically more removed from each other right now. Your family remains intact even if you have had to isolate during this time. Your family in Christ remains intact even as we have had to isolate during this time. Christ still connects us and has blessed us with some wonderful ways to stay connected to His Word and each other. Here are a few things to please keep in mind in these days of isolation (and most will be helpful anytime!).

- 1. Visit www.spvc.org for the most current updates on services and activities. We don't know when we'll be able to return to worshipping together at St. Paul.
- 2. Does the church have your current email address? Email christine.cox@spvc.org so we're up to date (include your cell too?). We want to keep you up to date with everything and this is a quick way to get information out.
- 3. Attend church via livestream or on-demand (or request a DVD). From www.spvc.org you can see our live services or you can watch at your convenience with our on-demand archives. Services and Bible Studies are available there and there is a link to bulletins and study handouts. We are SO blessed to already have this up and running

- long before these circumstances. If you'd like to help support the DVD/Livestream ministry, make a contribution and put "DVD/Livestream" in the memo.
- 4. Supporting the work of the congregation: Almost every expense of the congregation remains the same even when we're closed. You have lots of options available to you:
 - a. Send in your contribution via mail. You can send it in every week, one-time a month, or whatever is best for you.
 - b. Bill-Pay from your bank. They will often be able to schedule a check to be sent however you'd like.
 - c. Give Online at www.spvc.org and click "Give Online." It's secure and fast.
- 5. Telephone some fellow members and check in with each other. How can you pray for them? What's been the hardest part of staying home? What's been most surprising?

We are still the Body of Christ and God has not forgotten you during these days. Keep looking for the ways God has sustained His blessings to you even during these struggles. We're also here to bear one another's burdens, so if you or someone you know has a need, please reach out and let us know.

Put away distractions! No phones, sipping on coffee, pets, etc. Nothing that makes it feel like you're just watching TV.


Watch LIVE or on-demand. Services stream once, live, but then are available to start whenever you're ready.
