THE JESSE TREE IS THE JESUS TREE!

“There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit.” (Isaiah 11:1)

It is Advent—a time to reflect, pray, and worship the Christ who came, who comes, and who will come again. Imagine the world some two thousand years ago in the weeks before the birth of the Babe of Bethlehem. People were busy doing whatever it was that defined their lives at that moment. For some, it was struggling against hunger, fear, and desperation. For others, it was enjoying their wealth and ease. For yet others, it was simply dealing with the pressures of their lives. But for all, the weeks we call “Advent” were just days and nights lived in darkness.

And indeed, it is a dark world. God had created the world to live in union with Him. He had breathed life into the father of our race, Adam, a creature of dust. He had formed Eve from the side of Adam and had joined the two together and to Himself. How bright the world must have been as Eden lived in harmony with the Creator.



But darkness came. Those created and loved by God rebelled against Him, bringing a darkness that permeated all creation. Death had entered through sin, and as the children of Adam filled the world, they took with them the darkness of that dreadful day in Eden when sin and death entered the world.

It was a world of darkness cut off from the source of all light, the Creator. Yet a light was breaking into the world. A young girl carried in her virgin womb a Son. This daughter of Eve was about to give birth to the One who would be the light of the world. This infant would reverse forever the horror of humanity's fall into sin and death and darkness. This was the miracle of miracles: our human sister Mary became, by the power of the Holy Spirit, the mother of God, the bearer of the Savior of the world.

No human eye could perceive it that night. All that could be seen was a child. Yet this child would forever destroy the darkness, for He brought life into death, and His light was to be the light of the world.

Every force of Satan would seek to put that light out. Herod would attempt to destroy Him by killing every male infant. Scribes and Pharisees would seek to silence Him as He spoke words of life. Failing to silence Him, they would seek to kill Him. Some thirty-three years after the first Christmas, the Babe of Bethlehem would be nailed to a cross. But this is what He had come to do. The Advent story, including the culminating Christmas story, is about a baby who had been born to die—yet not just to die but to be placed in the utter darkness of a tomb and on Easter morning to burst forth from the tomb. When the child of Mary rose from the grave, the light that began at Bethlehem shone so brightly that no one can put it out.

This Advent, we gather in the name of Jesus and consider His great story anew. The Jesse Tree is filled with symbols telling the story of Jesus from creation to His second coming. The story of the Bible, Old and New Testaments alike, is the story of Jesus. He is the Seed of Jesse's tree. He is the Root of Jesse's tree. He is the Life of Jesse's tree. And He is the First-fruit of Jesse's tree. As the Church will sing with the angels on Christmas Day, "To God on high be glory and peace to all the earth" (*LSB* 383).

COMMUNION OPPORTUNITIES Pastor is offering times when members can come to the church and receive communion separate from our regular worship times. Pastor and the Elders realize that there are some for whom attending a larger gathering is not recommended right now so we would like to provide a variety of opportunities to receive communion:

1. Check the posted times for “walk-in” communion below.
2. Scheduling an appointment with Pastor at church or in your home.

“Walk-In” times at Church:

- Sundays, 1pm – 2pm
- Tuesdays, 5pm – 7pm
- Arrive anytime and come to the Fellowship Hall.
- We recommend you wear a mask before entering the building and keep it on until it is time to receive communion.
- There will be four waiting areas in the fellowship hall so that you can wait for the next opportunity.
- Pastor will come and welcome the next household group into the sanctuary where you can sit in the first row of pews.
- The service will consist of confession and absolution, prayer, creed, Lord’s Prayer, Words of Institution, Distribution, and a blessing. This is similar to home communion visits.
- Between groups, pastor will sanitize the area just used and prepare a fresh setup of communion elements. We will also alternate setups from pulpit side and lectern side to allow ample time for sanitation solutions to work.
- Pastor will then return to the fellowship hall and welcome the next household group that is waiting.

Scheduling an appointment for communion at church or in your home:

- To schedule a time other than the walk-in times
 - Call Pastor 440-458-0189
 - Visit www.spvc.org and click “Book with Pastor” to see available times for appointments.

TITHES & OFFERINGS are needed; our Lord still provides for us and we return to Him a portion of His generosity. You have several ways to continue contributing:

1. In-person Worship on Sundays at 8:00 & 10:00 AM
2. Mail your contributions to the church.
3. Talk to your bank about “bill-pay” options. They can likely send a check directly to the church on a scheduled basis.
4. Visit www.spvc.org and click on “Give Online” - you’ll be taken to our secure online giving site where you can make a one-time or on-going contribution.

RETURNING TO IN-PERSON WORSHIP 8:00 AM & 10:30 AM

- If you, or someone in your household would be considered “high-risk” for complications related to COVID-19, please be safe and stay home. Or, if you are not feeling well, or if someone in your household is not feeling well, please be considerate of others and be safe and stay home.
Included with this packet is a current description of “high-risk” categories.
- **Recommend** wearing a face covering/mask.
- Maintain social distancing (6-feet or more from others and no handshakes/hugs/etc.)
- **Entering:**
 - Sanitize your hands as you arrive please.
- **Bulletin:**
 - Pick up a bulletin at the table near the Welcome Center.
 - It is yours to keep! It contains the entire service including readings and hymns.
- **Offering**
 - Continue to make use of automatic giving via your bank or our website.
 - If you have brought your offering with you, place it in the basket as you pick up your bulletin.
- **Seating**
 - Every-other pew has been sectioned off. They have also been sanitized between services.
 - Please sit as a family unit with appropriate social distance between your family and others.
 - If we reach capacity in the sanctuary, we will provide additional seating in the Narthex and Fellowship Hall.
- **Communion**
 - Pastor and an assistant will have just washed their hands and will be wearing masks and gloves.
 - Ushers will dismiss one family unit at a time to come forward and receive communion.
 - Communion will be received standing at the bottom of the steps, as we have done from time to time.
 - Place your hand out flat so that Pastor can place the Body of Christ into your palm.
 - Then, you take an individual cup from the tray.
 - Place the empty cup into the basket and utilize the hand sanitizer provided, if you desire.
 - Return to your seat via the narthex around to the back of the sanctuary (instead of the side aisles).
- **Leaving**
 - Ushers will dismiss pews beginning at the back of the sanctuary.
 - Please limit your lingering in the Fellowship Hall but rather make your way directly to the parking lot.
 - You are welcome to remain outside to greet one another. Please continue to observe appropriate social distancing.

What You Can do if You are at Higher Risk of Severe Illness from COVID-19

Are You at Higher Risk for Severe Illness?



Based on what we know now, those at high-risk for severe illness from COVID-19 are:

- People aged 65 years and older
- People who live in a nursing home or long-term care facility

People of all ages with underlying medical conditions, particularly if not well controlled, including:

- People with chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma
- People who have serious heart conditions
- People who are immunocompromised
 - Many conditions can cause a person to be immunocompromised, including cancer treatment, smoking, bone marrow or organ transplantation, immune deficiencies, poorly controlled HIV or AIDS, and prolonged use of corticosteroids and other immune weakening medications.
- People with severe obesity (body mass index [BMI] of 40 or higher)
- People with diabetes
- People with chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis
- People with liver disease

Here's What You Can do to Help Protect Yourself



Stay home if possible.



Wash your hands often.



Avoid close contact and stay at least 6 feet (about 2 arms' length) from other people.



Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces.



Cover your mouth and nose with a cloth face cover when around others.



Cover coughs and sneezes.

Call your healthcare provider if you are sick.

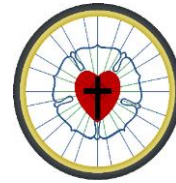
PRISON MINISTRY
